#### Measure A Essential Health Care Services Tax

n March 4, 2004, 71% of Alameda County voters passed Measure A, which imposed a half-cent sales tax to support emergency medical, hospital inpatient, outpatient, public health, mental health, and substance abuse services to indigent, low-income, and uninsured adults, children, families, seniors and other county residents.

## Services Provided by Measure A

- Behavioral health, acute, ambulatory, emergency, urgent and trauma services at Highland Hospital and other public hospitals and wellness centers
- Sobering services, post-detox planning, placement, and referral, 12-step groups, de-escalation and case management
- Mental health screening, suicide prevention, ongoing treatment planning and services, mental health on-call/emergency service, and administration of psychotropic medications for individuals in county jails
- Interactive alcohol, tobacco and other drug prevention programs for low-income, high-risk minority youth
- Individual counseling for domestic violence victims

#### **Impact on Alameda County**

- 11,420 visits to John George Psychiatric Emergency Services in a year.
- 52% reduction in the number of individuals entering the emergency department with a diagnosis of intoxication due to Cherry Hill detoxification and sobering services.
- 1,563 students in the eight school districts received behavioral health supports in a year from the Center for Healthy Schools & Communities.
- 58% increase in the number of clients served at the combined Cherry Hill Detoxification and Sobering Center from the previous year.
- 50% to 100% reduction of suicide rate among inmates between 2004 and 2012 from interventions by Behavioral Health Care Services.
- 284 domestic violence victims received counseling sessions in a year.
