Host Community Meetings on Home Together Fund***Meetings in every Supervisorial District will detail how new fund will address  
homelessness challenges in Alameda County*

**Alameda County, CA**— Alameda County Health, Housing and Homelessness Services, in partnership with the Board of Supervisors, will host a series of informational meetings in November and December to detail how the Home Together Fund, supported by revenue from the voter-approved Measure W sales tax, will help address homelessness challenges as part of the County’s Home Together 2030 Plan.

Voters passed Measure W in November 2020, and the revenues were collected in an escrow account until the measure cleared legal challenges in April 2025. In July 2025, the Board of Supervisors designated \$585 million in accrued Measure W revenue and 80% of annual Measure revenue over the next six years (approximately \$136 million per year) for the Home Together Fund.

“We know that housing and homelessness issues impact residents in every corner of Alameda County,” said Alameda County Board President David Haubert. “Our Home Together Fund will bolster critical programs that will help move people out of homelessness and into safe, supportive housing. We’re here to answer residents’ questions about how our plan can accomplish these goals.”

The Home Together Fund supports:

- **Prevention:** Targeted homelessness prevention services including one-time emergency financial assistance, shallow subsidies, and housing stabilization services for households most at risk of homelessness.
- **Shelter:** Investments to expand, stabilize, and enhance interim housing/shelter programs across the county.
- **Housing:** Rental assistance, operating subsidies, and tenancy sustaining services for new and existing permanent housing resources dedicated to those experiencing homelessness.



## Alameda County Health

- **Access & Coordination:** Resources to sustain & expand housing navigation, access points, street health; and enhance coordination and capacity building across the county.
- **One-Time Capital Investments:** One-time investments to preserve, enhance, and expand interim and permanent housing sites across the county

“We are grateful for this meaningful investment in compassionate and evidence-based solutions to end homelessness in our county,” said Jonathan Russell, director of Housing and Homelessness Services at Alameda County Health. “These community meetings will help residents understand and provide feedback on how their tax dollars will make a tangible difference in the lives of those experiencing homelessness, those who are at risk of falling into homelessness, and in the overall quality life of our community.”
